What is a Retail Clinic?

A retail clinic is a small retail-based facility that provides basic and preventive health care services seven days a week, including evenings and weekends. Retail clinics are usually located in drug stores and staffed by certified registered nurse practitioners who diagnose and treat common health problems, such as colds, the flu or poison ivy.

What is an Urgent Care Center?

An urgent care center is a freestanding full-service, walk-in health care clinic that is accessible 12 hours a day, Monday through Friday and eight hours each on Saturday and Sunday with no appointment required. Urgent care centers generally provide the same services as a family or primary care physician, such as treatment of minor illnesses, sprains and other injuries, physicals and immunizations, as well as some testing services, like x-rays and blood tests.

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
